CITIZEN PARTICIPATION Review Board Policy 0167.3: Public Participation at Board Meetings

The Board of Education recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on District matters.

To permit fair and orderly public expression, the Board shall provide a period for public participation at every regular meeting of the Board and publish rules to govern such participation in Board meetings. The rules shall be administered and enforced by the presiding officer of the meeting.

The presiding officer shall be guided by the following rules:

- A. Public participation shall be permitted as indicated on the order of business, or at the discretion of the presiding officer.
- B. Participants must be recognized by the presiding officer and will be requested to preface their comments by an announcement of their name, address, and group affiliation, if and when appropriate.
- C. Each statement made by a participant shall be limited to three (3) minutes duration.
- D. No participant may speak more than once.
- E. Participants shall direct all comments to the Board and not to staff or other participants.
- F. The presiding officer may:
 - 1. interrupt, warn, or terminate a participant's statement when the statement is too lengthy, personally directed, abusive, obscene, or irrelevant;
 - 2. request any individual to leave the meeting when that person does not observe reasonable decorum;
 - 3. request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person's conduct interferes with the orderly progress of the meeting;
 - 4. call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum so interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting as to warrant such action;
 - 5. waive these rules with the approval of the Board when necessary for the protection of privacy or the administration of the Board's business.
- G. The portion of the meeting during which the participation of the public is invited shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes, but the timeframe will be extended, if necessary, so that no one's right to address the Board will be denied.
- H. Tape or video recordings are permitted. The person operating the recorder should contact the Superintendent prior to the Board meeting to review possible placement of the equipment, and agrees to abide by the following conditions:
 - 1. No obstructions are created between the Board and the audience.
 - 2. No interviews are conducted in the meeting room while the Board is in session.
 - 3. No commentary, adjustment of equipment, or positioning of operators is made that would distract either the Board or members of the audience while the Board is in session.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Appointment of Audit Firm: Audit Engagement Letter - Hungerford Nichols

We will need a motion to approve the appointment of the District's auditing firm for the 2020-2021 school year. It is the recommendation of the superintendent that the District continue to use the auditing services of Hungerford Nichols as the district's audit firm for the 2020-2021 school year. The approval of the firm will authorize the superintendent and the Board treasurer to sign and execute the audit engagement letter with Hungerford Nichols.

Elementary Bond Project Application and Certificate for Payment #2

We will need an action item to approve the certificate for payment on the elementary school bond project and to authorize the District to pay \$194,600.01, as certified by the architect and construction manager, and as outlined in the Certificate for Payment.

Budget Amendment for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2020 (2019-2020 School Year)

Jesse Rickard will discuss the final budget amendment for the year ending June 30, 2020 with the Finance Committee of the Board. The Board of Education will also review the final budget amendment and will be asked to approve the final budget amendment for the year ending June 30, 2020 at the Board of Education on June 22, 2020.

Proposed Budget for 2020-2021 and Public Budget Hearing

Jesse Rickard will present the 2020 - 2021 fiscal year budget in the public budget hearing to the Board on Monday, June 22, 2020. The Board is required to approve a budget prior to June 30, 2020. The committee will review the assumptions used to build the budget, as well as the preliminary budget build for the 2020 - 2021 fiscal year prior to the meeting on Monday.

Review of Taxable Value and L-4029 Form

We will review the taxable value information for 2020 from Mason County, as provided to Ludington Area School District, and will review Form L-4029, as approved by the Board of Education at the Board meeting on May 18, 2020.

The property tax millage rate proposed to be levied to support the proposed budget for 2020 - 2021 will be a subject of the District's budget hearing on Monday, June 22, 2020.

Staffing Plan and Budget Expenditure Reductions

We will discuss the staffing plan for the 2020-2021 school year and the staffing reductions and assumptions that were used in the development of the 2020-2021 budget.

School Building Appraisals and Developing a Plan

As discussed at the May 18, 2020 Board of Education meeting, the District has received the appraisals of Foster School, Lakeview Elementary School, and Pere Marquette Early Childhood Center. The appraisals were conducted by Northern Michigan Real Estate Consultants, and was based on market value being defined in the Agencies' appraisal regulations as the most probable price which a property should bring in a competitive and open market under all conditions requisite to a fair sale, the buyer and seller each acting prudently and knowledgeably, and assuming the price is not affected by undue stimulus. The table below outlines a brief summary of the appraisal for each building:
